<p>Total or partial absence of pigment, causing abnormal optic nerve development</p> <p>Lenses and tinted lenses may be prescribed.</p>	<p>Decreased acuity</p> <p>Photophobia</p> <p>Increased sensitivity to glare</p> <p>High refractive error</p> <p>Astigmatism</p> <p>Central scotomas</p> <p>Nystagmus</p> <p>Eye muscle imbalance</p> <p>Eye fatigue with close or detailed work</p> <p>Reduced depth perception</p>	<p>Magnification (e.g., hand-held magnifier, electronic magnifier, screen enlargement software, monocular / telescope, etc.)</p> <p>Close viewing</p> <p>High contrast materials</p> <p>May need to use sunglasses, visors, or hats outdoors and indoors as well</p> <p>Lighting from behind</p> <p>Reduced glare</p> <p>Line markers, templates, placeholders</p> <p>Frequent breaks</p> <p>Prosthetic, iris occluding contact lenses</p>
