





The National Ophthalmic Disease Genotyping and Phenotyping Network (eyeGENE[®]) is a genomic medicine initiative created by the National Eye Institute (NEI), part of the National Institutes of Health (NIH). The core mission of eyeGENE[®] is to facilitate research into the causes and mechanisms of rare inherited eye diseases and accelerate pathways to treatments. eyeGENE[®] collects genetic testing, clinical information, and imaging from participants. https://eyegene.nih.gov







North Tower


